

## **Why consider moving to our area?**

### **Towns around Leipzig, SK**

The towns of Wilkie (pop. 1,195), Biggar (2,133), Kerrobert (970), Unity (2,496), Landis (133), and Kindersley (4,567) offer a blend of small-town charm and essential services in Saskatchewan's heartland. Housing is notably affordable, with median home prices around **\$180,000 in Wilkie** and **\$171,725 in Kerrobert**, making these communities attractive for families, retirees, and first-time buyers.

Residents are drawn by the strong sense of community, access to recreational amenities like parks, golf courses, and arenas, and the presence of supportive services such as Prairie Branches Enterprises, which provides inclusive programs for individuals with intellectual disabilities across Wilkie, Biggar, Kerrobert, and Unity. Kindersley stands out as a regional hub with a robust economy tied to agriculture and oil, offering more urban conveniences while retaining a small-town feel. Whether for lifestyle, affordability, or community support, these towns provide a welcoming environment for those seeking a quieter pace with meaningful connections.

### **A short drive to the city**

The Battlefords area—comprising North Battleford and Battleford—are within an hour's drive of Leipzig and offers a rich mix of leisure and shopping opportunities that cater to residents and visitors alike. For shopping, the region features local favorites like Discovery Co-op, Guy's Furniture & Appliances, and She-NANIGANS boutique, alongside the Frontier Mall for broader retail options. Leisure activities span all seasons, with indoor fun at Gutters Bowling and Game Centre, the Battlefords Co-op Aquatic Centre, and the NationsWEST Field House.

Cultural attractions include the Allen Sapp Gallery, Chapel Gallery, and the Western Development Museum, which showcases Saskatchewan's agricultural heritage. Outdoor enthusiasts enjoy hiking and skiing on Finlayson Island, golfing at the North Battleford Golf & Country Club, and water sports at nearby Jackfish Lake. The area also hosts community events and festivals that bring vibrancy and connection to the region throughout the year.

### **Major Centre Nearby**

Saskatoon (pop. 367,336) located 1.5 hrs east of Leipzig offers a vibrant mix of leisure and shopping experiences, making it a dynamic destination for residents and visitors alike.

Shoppers can explore everything from major malls like Midtown and Lawson Heights to local gems such as the Saskatoon Farmers Market, Broadway boutiques, and artisan shops like the Saskatchewan Craft Council and SaskMade Marketplace. For leisure, the city boasts cultural attractions including art galleries, museums, and seasonal festivals, as well as outdoor adventures along the Meewasin Valley trails and riverbank parks. The city is also home to the **John G. Diefenbaker International Airport (YXE)**, located just northwest of downtown. YXE serves over 1.4 million passengers annually and offers flights to major Canadian cities and seasonal international destinations. The airport features modern amenities, including restaurants, shops, and public art displays, and is accessible via Saskatoon Transit and taxis

### **Employment for spouses, kids in the area**

Employment in West Central Saskatchewan is currently strong and growing, reflecting broader provincial trends. As of August 2025, Saskatchewan added 16,500 full-time jobs year-over-year, with the unemployment rate at just 4.7%, the lowest in Canada and well below the national average of 7.1%

The region benefits from a diverse economy, with significant job growth in health care and social assistance (+12.8%), construction (+11.4%), and accommodation and food services (+15%)

The Government of Saskatchewan's Labour Market Outlook forecasts continued demand in key sectors such as agriculture, trades, education, and energy, with detailed projections available for over 400 occupations and 19 major industries

Local job boards like [SaskJobs.ca](https://saskjobs.ca) and [Your West Central Voice](https://yourwestcentralvoice.com) regularly post openings in towns like Kindersley, Rosetown, and Unity, ranging from skilled trades and healthcare to retail and government services.
